Progress To Date

Your funds were sent to our local partners in July, and the following six months are considered the planning stages of project implementation. Preparation is one of the most important stages of this process. Our partners use this time to assess and select which communities or schools will receive water points based on factors such as geography, need, community interest, the risk of overlap with other organizations, and the availability of spare parts for future repairs. Once the school or community locations are determined, water point management training begins and construction materials are transported to the site.

What's next?

In the next few months, the construction will accelerate. Once construction is complete, our local implementing partners will test the water quality and hand the projects over to the communities for ongoing maintenance and management. Meanwhile, trainings will take place covering topics such as sustainability, sanitation, and hygiene. We can't wait to share even more details in your next report!



About your sponsorship in Kenya

Welthungerhilfe (WHH), German for "World Hunger Aid," opened its Kenya office in 1993. To date, 36% of Kenya's population lacks access to basic water services, but WHH Kenya is working hard to change that statistic. They are currently working in Makueni County with charity: water's support.

Due to Makueni County's arid climate, most water sources are seasonal, and non-seasonal sources are often a long walk away. WHH Kenya works closely with the local government to identify and upgrade existing high-yield boreholes to solar-powered piped systems. These systems deliver clean water directly to communities, schools, and health centers. To engage community members throughout this process, WHH Kenya also forms and trains Water User Committees and Community Health Clubs.
